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CHAPTER

INTRODUCTION TO THE CHRISTIAN SPIRITUAL SEER REALM

Such seers possess heightened spiritual discernment and are blessed with visions, dreams, or insights directly revealed by the Spirit of God.

Seers are often regarded as intermediaries between the Lord and humanity, faithfully and consistently receiving divine messages, warnings, and guidance meant for individuals, communities, and even nations. Their visionary experiences offer profound spiritual discernment, direction, and revelation concerning present circumstances and future occurrences.

It is essential to acknowledge that the Seer realm is closely associated with the prophetic ministry while not being confined solely to it. Seers may also exhibit other spiritual gifts, such as prophecy, discernment, or the Word of knowledge (See 1 Cor 12:7-10). However, it should be noted that not all who possess the prophetic gift are necessarily seers, as the prophetic faculty manifests diversely.

Activation and growth of the Seer realm necessitate an intimate relationship with God, characterized by a lifestyle of fervent prayer, worship, and adherence to spiritual disciplines. Sensitivity to the leading of the Holy Spirit and a willingness to submit to Divine guidance serve as vital prerequisites. Seers often experience a heightened awareness of the spiritual realm, frequently encountering visions, dreams, or supernatural phenomena more regularly than others.

Prudent employment of the Seer realm, akin to any spiritual gift, necessitates wisdom, humility, and adherence to biblical principles. It behooves seers to evaluate their visions and insights against the infallible Word of God and seek confirmation or guidance from seasoned spiritual leaders or mentors.

The Seer realm constitutes a cherished spiritual gift that empowers individuals to perceive the spiritual realm and receive divine revelations. It profoundly provides guidance, insight, and encouragement to believers and the broader Church community.

UNDERSTANDING THE CONCEPT OF SEERS IN CHRISTIANITY

In the realm of Christianity, the prominence and precise definition of seers differ from specific other belief systems. Although the Bible mentions individuals who received divine visions and revelations, such as the prophets, it does not employ the term "seer" to describe them. Nevertheless, there are instances within the scriptures where individuals could be deemed seers by their ability to receive spiritual insights and foresight.

Within the Old Testament, prophets like Isaiah, Jeremiah, and Ezekiel often earned the distinction of seers due to their reception of visions and messages from God, which they then disseminated to the people. These visions frequently included prophecies of future events or insights into the plans and purposes of the Lord.

An illustration of this can be found with the prophet Samuel. In 1 Samuel 9:9, it is written, "Formerly in Israel, when a man went to inquire of God, he said, 'Come, let us go to the seer,' for today's 'prophet' was formerly called a seer." This passage implies that "seer" was used interchangeably with "prophet" in ancient Israel.

The New Testament likewise contains accounts of individuals receiving visions and revelations. The Apostle Paul said, "I will come to visions and revelations of the Lord" (See 2 Corinthians 12:1). The apostle John encountered a succession of visions, which he recorded in the Book of Revelation. These visions conveyed messages concerning forthcoming events and the ultimate triumph of God's kingdom.

Though seers in the context of Christianity may not possess as explicit a definition as in certain other religious traditions, the overarching concept of individuals receiving divine insights and visions remains present. These individuals are often regarded as prophets or conduits through which God communicates His messages to His people. Their role encompasses conveying God's will, delivering His warnings, and guiding the faithful.

EXPLORING THE BIBLICAL FOUNDATION FOR SEERS

In the Bible, the term "seer" describes a specific type of prophet who receives divine revelation through visions and dreams. The role of seers is mentioned in several passages throughout the Old Testament, particularly in the books of Samuel, Kings, and Chronicles. Let's explore the biblical foundation for seers.

1. Samuel: Samuel was a prophet and a seer. In 1 Samuel 9:9, the term "seer" describes Samuel before he became a recognized prophet. It says, "Formerly in Israel, if someone went to inquire of God, they would say, 'Come, let us go to the seer,' because the prophet of today used to be called a seer."
2. Saul's encounter with seers: In 1 Samuel 9-10, Saul, the first king of Israel, seeks guidance from Samuel regarding his lost donkeys. Samuel, being a seer, had received a revelation from God about Saul's visit even before he arrived. This event demonstrates the prophetic and visionary aspect of the seer's role.
3. Nathan the seer: Nathan was a prophet and seer during the time of King David. In 2 Samuel 7, Nathan receives a vision from God regarding establishing David's dynasty. God reveals to Nathan that David's offspring will build a house for God, and this vision plays a crucial role in shaping David's understanding of his dynasty.
4. Gad the seer: Gad was a prophet and seer who served as King David's seer. In 1 Samuel 22:5, Gad is mentioned as David's advisor, and in 2 Samuel 24:11-14, God speaks to Gad and instructs him to deliver a message and a choice of punishments to David for his census. This illustrates Gad's role as a seer and a mediator between God and the king.

5. Chronicles' references: In 1 Chronicles 29:29 and 2 Chronicles 9:29, the books mention the existence of seers during the reigns of various kings. These seers are distinct from the official prophets and associated with receiving God's visions and messages.

It is important to note that the role of seers is not limited to the Old Testament. We see similar prophetic and visionary experiences in the New Testament, such as the apostle Peter's vision in Acts 10. However, the term "seer" is not explicitly used to describe individuals in the New Testament.

Overall, the biblical foundation for seers rests on recognizing individuals who received divine revelation through visions and dreams, playing a significant role in guiding and advising

God's people.

CHAPTER 2

DIFFERENT WAYS THE SEER REALMS MANIFEST

The Bible's imagery of seven lamps or seven lampstands is most prominently found in the Book of Revelation. Seven Burning Lamps of Fire, before the Throne of God, is the fullness of the Holy Spirit upon the church we are called to breathe, feel, touch, and receive the ministry of Seven Burning Lamps of Fire.

1. ****Revelation 1:12-13****: "Then I turned to see the voice that was speaking to me, and on turning I saw seven golden lampstands, and amid the lampstands one like a son of man, clothed with a long robe and with a golden sash around his chest."
2. ****Revelation 1:20****: "As for the mystery of the seven stars which you saw in my right hand, and the seven golden lampstands: the seven stars are the angels of the seven churches, and the seven lampstands are the seven churches."
3. ****Revelation 2:1****: "To the angel of the church in Ephesus write: 'The words of him who holds the seven stars in his right hand, who walks among the seven golden lampstands.'"

4. ****Revelation 4:5****: "From the throne came flashes of lightning, rumblings and peals of thunder. Before the throne, seven lamps were blazing. These are the seven spirits of God."

It's worth noting that the imagery of seven often symbolizes completeness or perfection in the Bible. The seven lampstands in revelation symbolize the seven churches to which John writes, and the "seven spirits of God" likely represent the Holy Spirit in His fullness.

Here, I will attempt to describe the ten prophetic manifestations that come from the throne room of God and must find expression in the believer's life when they encounter the realm of seven burning lamps of fire. The terminology I'm about to use in these descriptions is not standard terms in classical Christian theology or biblical studies, as I had received these terms in a visionary experience when I was caught up to the throne room of God.

PROPHETIC COMMON

These elements that are commonly associated with the prophetic or what's typical in the prophetic

1. ****Dreams and Visions****: Many prophets in the Bible received messages or insights from God through dreams or visions. Examples include Joseph, Daniel, and John (in the Book of Revelation).

2. ****Oracles****: Prophets often delivered oracles, which are direct messages or judgments from God. These messages could be of hope, warning, or judgment.
3. ****Call to Repentance****: A significant portion of prophetic messages, especially in the Old Testament, involved a call for the people to repent from their sins and return to God.
4. ****Foretelling and Forthtelling****: While prophets sometimes foretold future events (foretelling), a large part of their ministry was also proclaiming God's message about current situations (forthtelling).
5. ****Symbolic Actions****: Some biblical prophets performed symbolic actions to reinforce their messages. For instance, the prophet Isaiah walked naked and barefoot for three years as a sign against Egypt and Cush (Isaiah 20:2-3).
6. ****Encounters with God****: Prophets often had direct encounters or experiences with God, which set them apart and affirmed their prophetic call.
7. ****Opposition and Persecution****: Prophetic messages were not always welcomed. Prophets often faced opposition, rejection, or persecution because of their challenging or aggressive messages.
8. ****Inspiration by the Holy Spirit****: The prophetic gift is often attributed to the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, both in the Old and New Testaments.

RAW PROPHETIC

The idea of "raw prophetic" might be understood in a few ways depending on the context in which it's used:

1. ****Unfiltered Messages****: "Raw" implies something natural or unrefined. "Raw prophetic" refers to prophetic utterances or messages that come without polish, refinement, or interpretation—just the direct word or vision as received from the divine source.

In the church today, there's an emphasis on the immediacy of the prophetic experience and the active work of the Holy Spirit. The raw prophetic" will resonate in such settings, reflecting prophetic encounters' unfiltered, direct nature.

PROPHETIC COMMUNION

Holy Communion is an opportunity for a prophetic encounter or expression.

1. ****Prophetic Act in Communion****: Communion can be seen as a prophetic act in this context. Consuming the bread and wine (or juice in some traditions) is a remembrance of Christ's sacrifice, but it could also be seen as a prophetic declaration of His return. In 1 Corinthians 11:26, Paul says, "For whenever you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes." The concept of the coming of Christ here has very little to nothing about the "second coming," but the word "comes" is used here in the Greek word "erchomai," which means to appear and or light. Both these words describe a spiritual revelation, meaning when we have prophetic communion, we declare his revelatory appearing now; these are revelatory encounters provoked by communion. When Abraham had communion, it triggered a visionary experience with a divine personality called Melchizedek (See Genesis 18)
2. ****Receiving Prophetic Revelation During Communion****: During intimate moments of worship, such as communion, believers can receive prophetic insights, visions, or revelations from the Holy Spirit. In this sense, "prophetic communion" refers to a time of receiving communion where prophetic messages are also shared or received.
3. ****Prophetic Significance of Communion Elements****: The elements of communion—the bread and wine—have deep symbolic significance,

representing the body and blood of Christ. Some might delve deeper into the prophetic significance of these elements, drawing out deeper spiritual meanings or insights.

4. ****A Deeper Unity with Christ****: Communion is an act that symbolizes unity with Christ. In a prophetic sense, this unity signifies a more profound spiritual revelation or understanding of one's relationship and position in Christ.

DEEP PROPHETIC

When the term "deep prophetic" is used, it means:

1. ****Profound Revelations****: The term describes prophetic insights perceived as incredibly profound, significant, or revealing deeper spiritual truths.

PROPHETIC ECSTATIC

PROPHETIC ECSTASY

Prophetic ecstasy is a trance-like state often associated with prophetic experiences or revelations. Historically, in various religious traditions, specific prophetic experiences were accompanied by an altered state of consciousness, during which the individual might receive visions, messages, or insights from the divine.

Here are some key points to understand about prophetic ecstasy:
